Nizar was born in Tanzania, spent his childhood there and speaks Swahili fluently. He has been on the board for a year serving as treasurer. Financial Report (Georgia)	 During 2021, trained by Nizar and mentored as Treasurer. Spent aprox \$85K in Igoma. Very few expenses as we are all volunteers here in Canada. Funds raised by sponsors/supports go directly to Igoma. Annual dinner raises approximately \$35K. Provides vast majority of our funds each year. Donations dropped \$10K from 2020 to 2021. Expenses dropped by \$2K. Expect these numbers will stabilize in the coming year.
Directors Report (Peter)	Peter read the Chair's report which is contained within the AGM package. Please refer to this document for specific details. The ked everyone for their centinued efforts in supporting.

ICare Update (Gabby)	 Program supported 113 children each month. Funds allocated depending on individual needs of families. Strong emphasis on education and working hard at school. Some have graduated and moved onto higher education. Gabby continues to work closely with SIP Tanzanian Director. Off to great start in 2022. Very thankful for our donors and sponsors for the continued strength of the program.
New Business	 Q – will there be a trip at Christmas? Justin unsure at this time. Perhaps 3–4 week trip if it were to happen. Nizar – follow-up on report from the Organizational Health Report. Push for self-sufficiency. Peter – report spoke about the challenge. When World Vision goes into a community, plan is to be in/out in 15 years. SIP is now at year 18/19. Report confirmed significant impact of our work. Example in child sponsorship program. Staff visit children/families to determine specific needs. Perhaps take a more holistic approach in terms of education, spirituality, how to grow as a family. Salaries also need to be raised at Urafiki. Workers at clinic paid less at similar hospital/clinic nearby. Consultants confirmed we're paying 60% of rate. Definite focus for 22/23. Very encouraging how welcoming the team in Tanzania was to the auditors – concern that they would take offense to this approach. Consultants/auditors did a wonderful job of working with locals which was extremely positive. Came to agreement on what the needs are. Big movement for charities to partner with each other. A lot more collaboration to help drive to the same outcome.
Fundraising	 Not many micro fundraisers this past year due to covid. On track for strong fundraising dinner this year Oct 21. 2022. Expect to raise \$9-10K for corporate sponsors this year. Smaller venue this year for dinner but expect a sell-out. Auction is now online and potential for higher return is significant. Plans to hold Christmas concert and other micro fundraising events in the year ahead. Social media will be used to help increase exposure of SIP. Changes at school boards has caused challenges with work in local schools in Stouffville. Justin excited to work with Nizar on fundraising efforts this year.
Election of Directors	 Justin will remain on the board Marcus will remain on the board Peter will remain on the board Nizar has decided to step down from the board. Thank you for your tremendous contribution to the program! Nizar will

	continue to help out (perhaps in fundraising role) Georgia will remain on the board Gabby will remain on the board There is a need for communications assistance and website support for those who want to help.
